

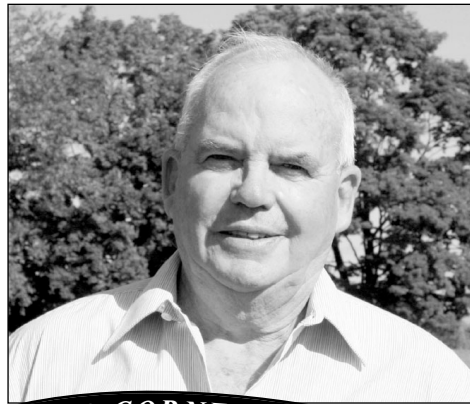
Continue the Legacy ... Because Rhinebeck Matters!

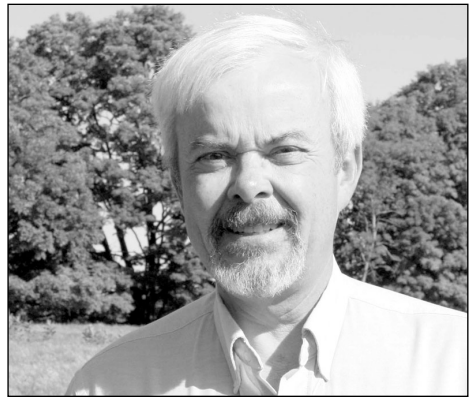
- ★ **Preserving our quality of life** - protecting our farm lands and open space - providing affordable housing - adopting a Comprehensive Plan and a new Zoning Law
